QUESTION 1: What percent of your resources and time are dedicated to government versus enterprise? Do you find that one takes priority over the other?

About 5 to 10% based on the projects underconsideration. The priority is determined by the tasks and the criticality of the tasks that need to be accomplished.

QUESTION 2: What services do you share? How much cost do you estimate that you save by sharing these services rather than separating?

KNOW THE RULES

Now that it s January, it s time to start working on tax-related reporting. Tribes and their various enterprises and activities are required to supply various returns to employees, vendors, and others who receive payments from them.

Other returns must also be provided to the IRS. It can get complicated, but the key to success is to KNOW THE RULES.

- What information are you required to report?
 - Who are you required to report to?
 - What is the deadline for reporting?
- What requirements must you meet, based upon the type or quantity of return (will you need to submit on paper or electronically, or some combination thereof)?
- Will entities need to be aggregated or reported separately under their own Tax ID Numbers (TINs)?
- Will your software require updates to meet current requirements?

Avoiding issues with the IRS can be done if you take the time to KNOW THE RULES.



How Tribes Structure & Staff Their Departments & Support Teams

INSIDER'S INSIGHT from TribalHub's Executive Officer, Mike Day



This month's Industry Insights is a further drill-down into how tribes structure and staff their departments and support teams based upon organization size. We use total enrolled tribal members and gaming slot machine totals as key sizing metrics. In the infographic below we take a closer look at organizations that have a single technology department that supports the organization's government, health, member services and enterprises (including gaming)



What's the average staff size of tribal technology teams who have a single combined IT team for both government and gaming?

The data shows some of what you would expect to see, which is that the number of resources generally increases as organizations grow larger. Specific to casino gaming, the size of a technology team does generally increase in-line with the size of a tribes gaming enterprise. However, when looking at support for government, health and member services the size of the team supporting the organization is not driven solely by the number of enrolled tribal members, but more so by the scope of and the number of services that tribe provides to its membership. The disparity in resources is particularly apparent in tribes with under 3,000 tribal members, where the scope of services offered by those tribes to their members varies substantially. A key takeaway is that when used by itself, the number of enrolled tribal members is not necessarily indicative of the resources necessary to support the organization.

Properly sizing departments, support teams and services is an important part of running any effective organization. TribalHub gives you access to data to help you with that process.
